The start of a school year is a very busy time as we resettle into the routine of school life. In the first few weeks the focus of all classrooms has been on building relationships, learning, exploring and implementing routines and expectations of our workshop model and the role of both students and teachers in learning. Exploring and understanding Learner Qualities are an important component of this work. Learner Qualities are those behaviours that enhance the student's ability to learn. Learner Qualities are life skills that are essential for success at school and in everyday life.

At Nicholson Primary School we focus on the 6 Learner Qualities – Self-Aware, Resourceful, Persist, Use Feedback, Reflect and Connect. We have attached a Learner Qualities booklet that students will use at school for your information and to use as a discussion resource for you to use at home with your children.

Book Club

This is the first Book Club catalogue for the year. This is a great way to encourage your child to read and also help the school to accrue bonus points to buy new books for the school. Our school orders once per term. If you would like to place an order please return form back to school by, Tuesday 26thFebruary. The orders usually take 7 -10 days and if you would like the items as a gift please advise us and we will contact you once the order has arrived.

Drought Relief Package and CSEF Drought Assistance

Last week information was sent home on the Drought Response Package from State Schools Relief and the CSEF Drought Assistance. These two packages are available to <u>all students in the East Gippsland</u> Shire.

Drought Response Package has 3 options to choose from:-

Package 1 Uniform only

Package 2 Reduced uniform items and \$100 towards your child's school fees (Text Books)

Package 3 Limited uniform items and \$200 towards your child/s school fees (Text Books)

Please note that the school claims the (Text Book) allowance directly through State Schools Relief and we will credit this directly to your account which will be allocated to your 2019 fees.

The CSEF Drought Assistance payment of \$375 is a one-off amount to students who live in drought affected areas and is only available for 2019. This amount will be contributed to camps, sports and excursions.

CSEF (Means Tested) applications

CSEF is a means tested amount of \$125.00 to assist eligible families to cover the cost of school camps, sporting events and excursions. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible to CSEF. This allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, sports and excursions.

New eligible applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you have previously applied for CSEF please bring in your valid card to allow us to photocopy so it can be kept on file.

Applications will need to be completed for new students enrolments at this school for 2019 or, if there has been a change in circumstances. Please check with Sharon or Sally if you have any questions.

Conveyancing Allowance

A conveyance (transport) allowance is available for families to assist in transporting their children to the nearest appropriate school. The main eligibility criteria is if families reside 4.8km or more by the shortest direct route from the closest government school. If any families believe they might be eligible for this assistance, please call into the office to collect an application form. If you received the Conveyancing Allowance in 2018 and your circumstances have not changed, then you do not need to complete another application for 2019. **Applications must be returned by 28**th **February 2019.**

Classroom News

Class News Prep-1 (Lyn Gamble)

The first weeks of school involve setting expectations and learning routines. We have been practising different aspects of the workshop model which we will use during Reading, Writing and Numeracy workshops.

Reading

Our reading focus is learning strategies for Getting Knowledge Ready before reading. Making connections with a text before reading increases comprehension. The children have been practising Getting Knowledge Ready with their take home books, practising their self-talk with a partner.

Spelling

Prep students have been introduced to a Soundwaves chant and action for the following sounds, b, k, d, f, h and g. Once all the initial sounds have been introduced there will be a weekly focus on one sound and the letter or letters used to write each sound. Students are learning the chant and action and practicing saying the sound correctly.

Effective Learning Qualities

Children have made their own suggestions of what they think each Learner Quality relates to. In future weeks we will focus on one Quality a week and investigate how this strategy can help them become successful learners.

Thank you to the parents for making a big effort with home reading and coping with tired children!

Class News 2-3 (Jacob Hunt)

Over the past 2 weeks in the Grade 2/3 classroom, we have been adjusting to the new routines of the workshop model for reading and writing. This has included learning about our work book expectations and learning a new model for our lessons to follow.

Reading

We have been setting up the classroom library, exploring the different texts and practicing independent and partner reading.

Spelling

In spelling, we have been looking at making spelling choices by using the sound box as a resource.

Effective Learner Qualities

Since the beginning of week 2, our class has been exposed to the different qualities it takes to become an effective learner. We are excited to move into learning about each of these qualities in more depth over the rest of the term.

Numeracy

In Numeracy over the past couple of weeks, the grade 2/3's have been settling back into the routines of the classroom. We have been learning about how to incorporate the workshop model into our maths sessions and have begun looking at place value.

Class News 3-4 (Sue Clague)

Learner Qualities – We have spent time having a brief look at all 6 Learner Qualities and discussing what we think they are on preparation or unpacking each one more deeply over the coming weeks.

Reading

Revising, Getting Knowledge Ready has been a focus as well as becoming more familiar with the Reader's Workshop, learning how to learn.

Spelling

Listening and identifying sounds in words, identifying and counting syllables and reconnecting with sound boxes as a resource to help with spelling choices.

Numeracy

What does Place Value mean? Why is it important? Reading and recognising numbers up to 10,000's.

Class News Grade 5/6 (Carrie Dullard/Raina Strecker)

This week in the senior room, we are working hard on establishing our classroom culture by reviewing our school values, practising our workshop routines and learning our roles and responsibilities within this model.

- **Reading** Our focus this week is revising 'Getting Knowledge Ready' strategies before reading. We have also started to share and discuss authors Michael Morpurgo and Shaun Tan.
- Writing/Spelling- We are investigating how words work, how 44 speech sounds make up the English
 language and how different letters make these sounds, depending on the word they're in. Phonemes,
 as they are called, are important to hear when we say words in order to spell accurately.
- **Numeracy** We are investigating 6-7 digit numbers and the way they are used and represented. We are looking at population in our local area to illustrate this.

 We are also revising and developing quick/automatic recall of multiplication facts up to 10 x 10 (times tables) and practising problem solving collaboratively.
- In addition, the students have been introduced to the 6 'Effective Learner Qualities' that students can
 develop to become independent learners. We will explore these in more depth across the coming
 weeks.
